

More Hunting in a Provincial Park?

Proposal Will Increase ATV Use

The Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) is proposing more hunting in Kawartha

Highlands Provincial Park. The proposal extends the hunting season, adds more animals to the list of species to be hunted and includes the use of more All Terrain Vehicles (ATVs) in the park. New species to be hunted include snapping turtles, common grackle, brown-headed cowbird, American crow, porcupine and groundhog. The bear hunting season will also be increased.
