Ontario's Boreal Region is one of the largest carbon storehouses on the planet ~ **over 97 billion tonnes of stored carbon.**

Protecting stored carbon is essential for the survival of polar bear and many other species. The number one threat to polar bears is climate change. Vaporizing billions of tonnes of carbon with industrial development accelerates climate change.

And there is a risk the lands and watersheds could be compromised too.

We urgently need your help today. In these tough economic times revenues are down. But the cost of inaction is high. This is why I'm reaching out to you now.
