Michelle is generating support around the world with this petition, created after she read our August listserv about our new report: A snapshot of Caribou range condition in Ontario. The petition will be sent to both the Provincial and Federal Ministry of Natural Resources "to request their immediate action to protect these fragile ranges in order to ensure the survival of the 7 caribou populations identified in this study as being threatened."
